FOURTH FULGHAM-FULGHUM FAMILY ASSOCIATION REUNION PLANS SET

The Fourth reunion of the Fulgham-Fulghum Family will be held on Memorial Day weekend, May 27-28, 1989, in the Smithfield, Virginia area. Detailed plans have been made for us by James E. Fulghum of Wilson, President of FFFA. Details are found on page 3. Roadmaps of interest are found on pages 4 and 5. We plan to have maps locating areas of interest in the Smithfield area, such as Captain' Anthony's first land grant, at the reunion.

SCHEDULE

SATURDAY, May 27, 1989:

- 10:00 am Registration at Historic Benn's Church, N.E. Corner of US 258 & VA 10 intersection.
- 10:30 am Informal meeting; gathering of family information, Benn's Church.
-4:00 pm [Benn's Church is located on the N.E. Corner of the intesection of US 258 and VA 10 five miles S.E. of Smithfield and 13 miles north of Suffolk. It is 14 miles S.W. of Interstate 64 (exit 64) to US 258 in Hampton, Va.]. Note: Benn's Church and St. Luke's Churches are both in the community of Benn's Church, Virginia.]
- 11:00 am Car Tours to historic Fulgham points of interest - starting at Benn's Church throughout the day.
- 6:00 pm Dinner in the Park at Chippokes Plantation State Park on VA Highway 10 between Smithfield and Surry (about 25 miles from Benn's Church).

- 9:00 am First Worship Service, Historic St. Luke's Church
- 10:00 am Family business Session, Grounds of St. Luke's Church
- 11:00 am Second Worship Service, Historic St. Luke's Church

1989 REUNION DETAILS

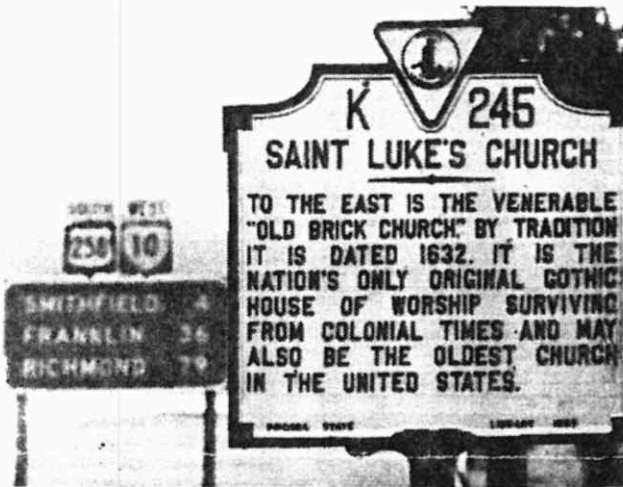
TRAVEL: SEE MAPS, PAGES 4 and 5. How to get there. The best way is by motor vehicle. Head toward Suffolk, Virginia. From the north, travel to Richmond, Virginia, then take Interstate 295 around Richmond, then Interstate 64 past Williamsburg to Newport News. Look for US 258 (Mercury Blvd.) and go south across the James River Bridge. Turn right on US 258 and continue to Benn's Church. Look for Benn's Church on the left at the intersection of US 258 and VA 10. St. Luke's Church is about 200 ft. west of the intersection on the right. If you are staying overnight in the Williamsburg area, you may wish to take either the Colonial Parkway or VA 31 to the Jamestown area, the toll ferry across the river, VA 31 to Surry, then VA 10 south past Smithfield to Benn's Church. St. Luke's Church will be on your left just before the intersection at Benn's Church and Benn's Church Building will be ACROSS the VA 10 - US 258 intersection. See map, p 5. From the west. If you come via Charleston, WVA, follow I-77 south to Wytheville VA then take I-81 to Roanoke VA. Enter Roanoke on I-581, turn off at US 460 (Orange Ave.) then follow US 460 to Suffolk, VA. (If I-64 is open between Beckley, WVA and Lexington, VA, take it, proceed to Richmond and follow directions above.) From Tennessee, follow I-40 to Greensboro, NC, then take I-85 to South Hill, VA then follow US 58 to Suffolk, Va. Those taking I-95 from the south should travel to Emporia, VA then take the US 58 bypass around the north of Emporia going east to Suffolk on US 58. Those having overnight accomodations in Suffolk will need to find VA route 10 and 32 going north (Main Street, I think) to Benn's Church. The Benn's Church will be on the right just before the intersection with US 258 and St. Luke's church on the right just past the intersection.

AIR TRAVEL: The closest airport for commercial airline service is the Norfolk International Airport about 25 miles from Suffolk motels. The Patrick Henry International Airport at Newport News is closer to Williamsburg. Plan on renting a car as there is no convenient public

HOUSING: In addition to the motels and Inns mentioned by James in the blue announcement, there are Holiday Inns in Suffolk and Newport News. Phone 800-HOLIDAY for reservations. Other Inns include Quality Inn and Comfort Inn in Suffolk, both of which

SCHEDULE: Saturday, May 27th. Registration will open at 10 am on the grounds of Benn's Church. Benn's church is across the intersection of US 258 and State Routes 10 & 32 from St. Lukes Church. Gathering Family Information, meeting other Fulghum's, etc. will begin at 10:30 am and continue until 4 pm. During that time there will be car tours to historic Fulghum points of interest starting at Benn's Church and continuing throughout the day. At 6 pm, all registered peticipants will meet for a dinner in the Park at Chippokes Plantation about 25 miles northwest of Benn's Church on Virginia State Route 10 and VA secondary route 634.

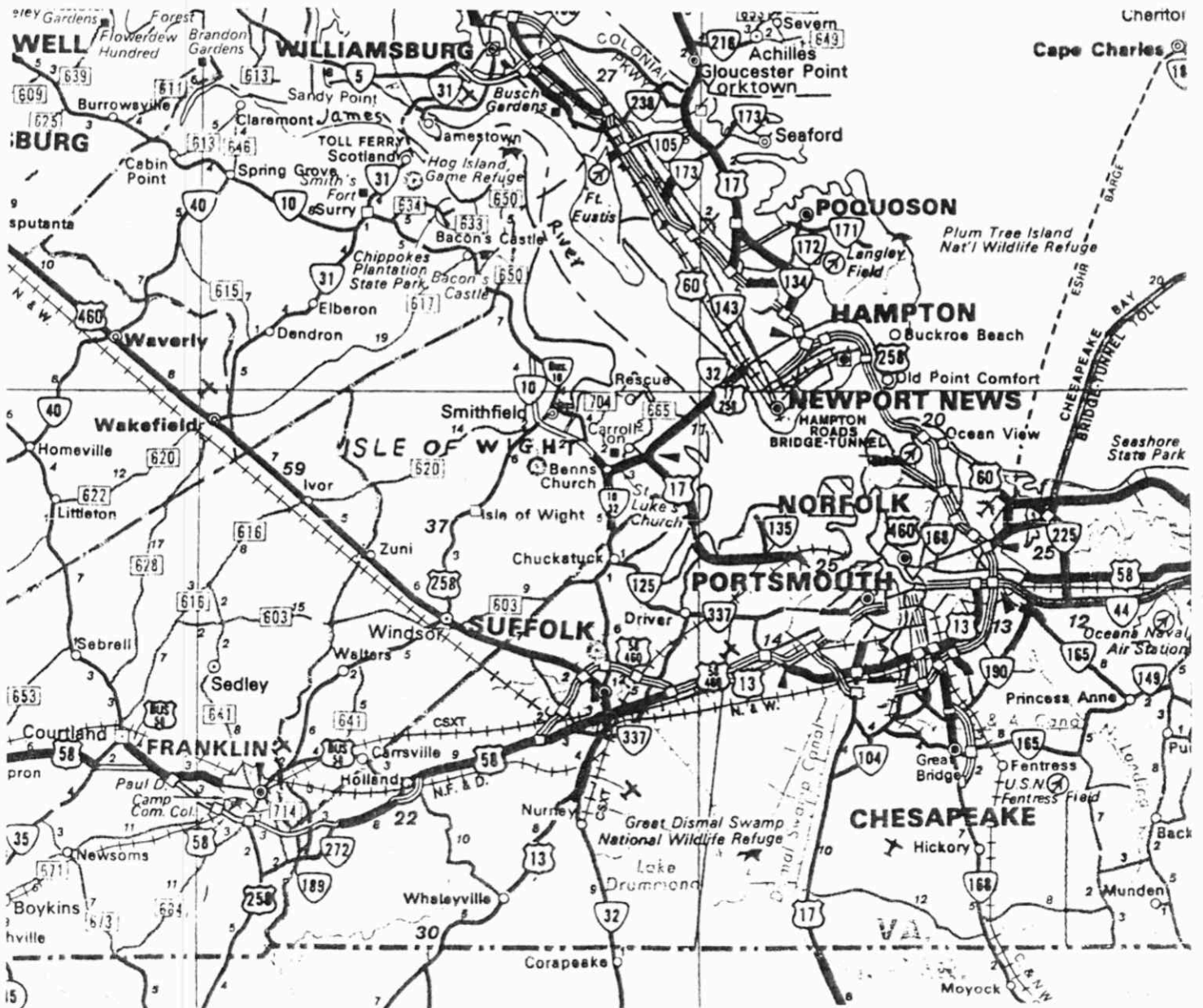

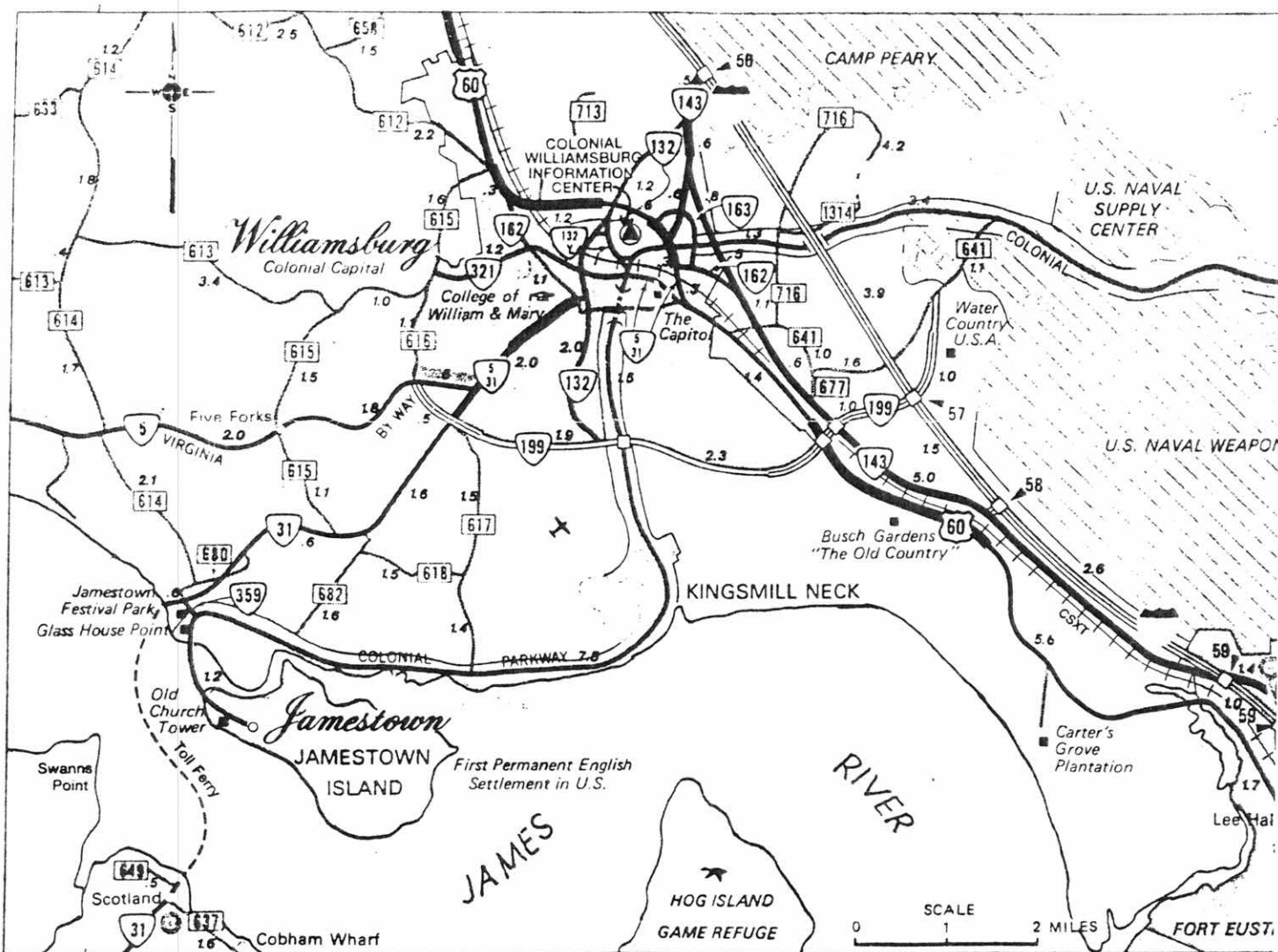


YOU ARE HOME!

JAMESTOWN, WILLIAMSBURG AND YORKTOWN AREA

COLONIAL WILLIAMSBURG

Originally known as Middle Plantation, an early seventeenth century outpost which had developed into a small village by 1690, the site was selected for development of a Capital city after the statehouse at Jamestown burned down for the fourth time. The College of William and Mary had already been established in 1695 nearby the site selected for the new city. Building began in 1699. The new city was named in honor of King William III of England.

After the reunion in the **Smithfield (Isle of Wight County) Virginia** area, May 27 and 28th, 1988, it is recommended that you give serious consideration of a visit to **Colonial Williamsburg, Virginia** which is nearby. Restored Colonial Williamsburg is today as it was in the early days. There you will find working trades people doing their work as it was done 300 years ago.
