An open letter to the Fulgham-Fulghum Family Association

Re: *Committee for Sustainability*

Dear Cousins,

It has come to my attention that after many years of steady progress, our family organization seems to be in need of some renewed strategic thinking to insure that all of the fruits of our research, organizing, and fundraising to date can be passed on to future generations.

Among the concerns:

Paid memberships are down. Though our newsletters go out to approximately 1,400 addressees, less than 200 are paying dues in the current membership cycle. With costs up, this is economically unsustainable.

Attendance at Family Reunions is also down. There is some question, based on responses to Cousin Peggy's postcard so far, as to whether a 2011 reunion is financially viable.

In addition, many of the people doing the heavy lifting on behalf of the family are getting on in years, or have health issues, or simply would like for other family members to share in this important volunteer work. Thus, there needs to be a succession plan to insure that the efforts of our elder members (and ancestors) are not lost.

Based on these concerns, I propose that an Ad-hoc committee be formed to study the situation and propose solutions, and to do so with dispatch.

The membership of this committee should be a mix of current board members and some new family members.

I welcome your suggestions about how best to carry this out.

Charles Brantley Ellis, Sr.:

A Past FFFNA President

Charles Ellis was active in the FFFNA. He organized the 1997 Reunion in Rock Ridge, NC and served as President of FFFNA in 1997-1998.

Charles commissioned a study of some of the materials in the North Carolina Archives, one result of which was to prove Spencer P Fulghum to be a son of Matthew Fulghum.

While studying the various lists of children of Matthew Fulghum (DB ID # 295) from several sources, I followed up the lineage of Charles Brantley Ellis, Sr. (DB ID # of Goldsboro, NC. from Matthew Fulghum as follows:

Matthew (295) --> Spencer P (3205) --> John P Fulghum (3208) --> Mary Jane Fulghum Ellis (3185) --> John B. Ellis --> Charles B. Ellis.

Mary Jane Fulghum and Barnes Robert Ellis (DB ID # 3186) married 21 January 1900 and had a son, John Brantley Ellis. John Brantley Ellis married Virginia Earp on 31 January 1924. She was born 20 September 1905. John and Virginia had a son, Charles Brantley Ellis, born on 19 October 1929 in Goldsboro, NC.

Charles served in the U.S. Navy for four years following graduation from High School in 1947, serving with the U.S. 7th Fleet aboard the USS Bon Homme Richard, CVA 31 during the Korean War.

Charles was awarded several medals and Commendations including the United Nations Service Medal with four stars and the Korean Presidential Unit Citation.

Charles enrolled in the University of Washington where he majored in cartography (maps). After joining the U.S. Coast and Geodetic Survey, he returned to Graduate School at both Seattle University and the University of Washington for studies in oceanography. Later, he was transferred to Survey Headquarters in Rockville, Maryland. He returned in 1987 as Chief, Program Services Division at NOAA, Atlantic Marine Center, Norfolk, Virginia.

Charles married first Elizabeth Ann Gordon of Seattle, WA on 18 September 1965. They had two children, Charles Brantley Ellis, Jr. and Dorothy Elizabeth Ellis.

After retiring and moving to Pikeville, NC, Charles has been engaged in numerous community and genealogical activities. In addition, Charles participated in a number of historical activities and was one of the major organizers of the Northern Wayne Heritage Museum.

Charles married second, Betty Bryan Alley on 29 August 1999 after the death of Elizabeth Ann. They currently live in Goldsboro, NC.

Eugene Sherrod. Fulghum Jr. July 8, 2010

Eugene S. Fulghum, Jr., age 76, passed away July 8, 2010. He was born October 30, 1933 in Halifax County, N.C., son of the late Eugene S. and Virginia Long Fulghum. He was educated in North Carolina schools and took college courses at East Carolina University and University of Maryland, Far East Division and numerous Air Force Technical and Leadership schools.

Gene served in the U.S. Air Force from August 1951 to October 1971

when he retired with the rank of Senior Master Sergeant. During his Air Force career he served at several stateside bases and in Japan and Vietnam. His many awards and decorations included the Air Force Meritorious Service, Bronze Star, Air Force Commendation, and Vietnam Service Medals. In 1968 he was named Outstanding Airman for the 4th Tactical Fighter Wing, Seymour Johnson AFB, N.C.

He married Patricia Ruth Brenniman on July 10, 1954 at Selfridge AFB, Michigan.

Following retirement from the Air Force, Gene accepted the position of Business Office Manager for Rome Memorial Hospital, a position he held until his retirement in October 1988. After a period of inactivity, he worked for Clinton Moving and Packing Co. and then for Chapman Farms, Inc as Bookkeeper and Office Manager.

Gene was active in St. John's Lutheran Church where he had served as Congregational Secretary and President, member of the Board of Elders, Christian Education, Audit Committee, Computer Committee and Usher.

He is survived by his wife of 57 years, Pat; two daughters and sons-in-law, Virginia F. and Louis DeMaio of Bowie MD, and Debra F. and Robert Wollaber of Rome; son and daughter-in-law, Charles and Kelly Fulghum of Rome; a sister, Jean F. Hudgins of Virginia Beach, VA; five grandchildren, Claire, James and Emily DeMaio, Trisha W. St. Thomas and husband Richard and Kathryn Fulghum; a great granddaughter, Emma St. Thomas; and several nieces and nephews. He was predeceased by his sisters and brothers-in-law, Edith F. and Carl Myrick and Jewel F. and John Broome.

Funeral services were held at St. John Evangelical Lutheran Church. Burial was in Rome Cemetery.

James T. Fulgham, age 84, died in November 2010 in Lake Charles, Louisiana. Jimmy was born in Sturgis, Mississippi on 16 December 1925, the son of Ollie A. J. R. Fulgham and Laura Jane (Coleman) Fulgham. Jimmy married Vera Mae Thibodeaux on 3 June 1950. His death was reported by his daughter, Linda Sue LeBleu. He was a past President of FFFNA. PRESTON BRANTLEY (PRES) FULGHAM, age 90, of Starkville, MS died August 22, 2010 at the Mississippi State Veteran's Home in Kosciusko, MS. Mr. Fulgham was born November 17, 1920 in Maben, MS the son of Pinckney Taylor Fulgham and Minnie Berta (Douglas) Fulghum. Mr. Fulgham was predeceased by an infant daughter, Julie Ann Fulgham. He is survived by his wife of 59 years, Annie Will (Wright) Fulgham of Starkville; son James Brantley Fulgham and grandson, Christopher Brantley Fulgham of Round Rock, Texas. Mr. Fulgham was a decorated pilot of a B-26 bomber in WW II, receiving the Purple Heart. After the war, he bought and operated a local community store. He served on the Board of Supervisors of Oktibbeha County, MS for 21 years and was instrumental in building several public buildings, Oktibbeha County Hospital, Public Library, new Courthouse and a county Health Clinic. Pres helped establish a vocational school in Mayhew, which is now East Mississippi Community College.

Mr. Fulgham was a charter member of the Sheriffs' Boys Ranch and was a member of the First Methodist Church in Starkville. Pres was a member of the American Legion and a member of the National Association of Uniformed Services. Following a graveside funeral, Mr. Fulgham was interred in Memorial Garden Park Cemetery in Starkville, MS.

Mr. George Maner Holliman, age 85, of Gibson Highway, Warrenton, GA, died Saturday, October 30, 2010 at the Warrenton Health & Rehabilitation Center. Mr. Holliman, a native and lifelong resident of Warren County was retired Superintendent, Warren County School System, Warrenton, GA. -He was the son of the late Marion Neal and Mary Elizabeth Fulghum Holliman. Survivors include his brother, Marion Lewellyn Holliman, two nieces, Kathy Belyeu Adameit, and Lucy Holliman Byers, one nephew, Altai Neal Belyeu, and a cousin, Linda Fulghum Bruggemann and many beloved friends and extended family. In addition to his parents, Mr. Holliman was preceded in death by his sister, Evelyn Holliman Belyeu and a nephew John Bunyan Holliman.

He was a 1941 graduate of Warren County High School and attended North Georgia College in Dahlonega before transferring to the University of Georgia in Athens where he graduated with a B.S. in dairy science. He later received his Masters in Education from UGA.

During WW II, he served his country as Sergeant in the 28th infantry division that took part in the Battle of the Bulge. He received three battle stars. After returning he taught veterans farming practices in Warren County. He spent 15 years as a classroom teacher. He was elected County School Superintendent in Warren County in 1956 and served in that office for 25 years before retiring. Active in the community, Mr. Holliman served on many committees for special events in Warrenton and Warren County. He was an active member of the First Baptist Church where he served as a deacon, Sunday School teacher and choir director. Music was always a big part of his life. He was a singer and had sung on national television. He enjoyed animals and throughout life owned many domestic and exotic animals. He was a member of many organizations associated with animals. He was a faithful member of the Warrenton Kiwanis Club, American Legion post 96 for over 55 years and was a life member of VFW post 5604 and served as an officer in these organizations. Funeral services were held Saturday, November 6, 2010 at the First Baptist Church of Warrenton. Burial with Military Honors followed at Sallie Hill Cemetery.

Edna Grace Fulghum Haymore, age 86, passed away Sunday, October 10, 2010 at the home of her daughter. Her influence and goodness were felt by all and she will forever be remembered for her kindness, gentle spirit, dedication and eagerness to serve. Born November 10, 1923, in Goldsboro, North Carolina, she was the daughter of Samuel Birchard Fulghum and Mary Ann Carraway Fulghum, and she was a grand daughter of Elizabeth Fulghum who married Stephen Henry Price.

Of the 24 national reunions the FFFNA has held (the first in 1985 in Rock Ridge, NC) the last five have been held: 2005 in Annapolis, MD; 2006 in Nacogdoches, Texas; 2007 in Williamsburg, VA; 2008 in Raleigh, NC; 2009 at Smith Mountain Lake (Wirtz, Virginia).
