With the help of **Woody Brown** of Savannah, Ga, we have decided to have the reunion at Sea Palms Golf & Tennis Resort, St. Simons Island, Georgia on the weekend of May 31st-June 2nd, 2013. Planning has been to try and keep the cost as low as possible so we can hopefully have a good turn out for this next reunion in 2013.

Our registration deadline for booking rooms at Sea Palms is May 1, 2013. So it is important to have all of your information and forms in the hands of Peggy Wood **no later than April 15, 2013**.

Our meals will consist of a "Country Style Buffet" – Tossed Salad, Fried Chicken, Roast Beef, Fried Fish, Squash Casserole and Collard Greens, Whipped Potatoes and Rice Pilaf, Cornbread, served with iced Tea or Coffee.

The sit down dinner will be have choices for you to select when you make your reservations. The choice will either be Mixed Green Salad, Chicken Piccata, Wild Rice, with seasonal Vegetable, Fresh Baked Bread, Iced Tea or Coffee. Troy Owen Tompkins November 23, 1914 - September 22, 2012



Troy Owen Tompkins, age 97, passed away Saturday, September 22, 2012 at his home, Arleigh-Burke Pavilion Assisted Living Center.

A native of Oconee, in Washington County, Georgia, Troy was the son of Charlie Owen Tompkins and Georgia Shurling Tompkins along with siblings: Emma, Harold, and Allen Tompkins.

He joined the Navy in 1933 for a four year term of service as an Apprentice Seaman (with the monthly pay of \$16.50).

Troy and his Tennille High School sweetheart, Ruby Kelley, daughter of **Pauline Fulghum Kelley**, were married on December 5, 1941 – two days before the attack on Pearl Harbor. World War II extended his Navy Service: He proudly served on the USS Wyoming, the USS Lang, the USS Fargo, the USS Alabama, the USS Pittsburgh, and the USS Newport News. Troy's military assignments also included York, Pennsylvania; Washington, D.C.; and Norfolk, Virginia-where he retired and the family settled. After 27 years of service, he retired as a U.S. Navy Lieutenant Commander in 1960. He subsequently worked for the State of Virginia for 17 years at the Hampton Roads Sanitation District.

He and Ruby had five children: Anne, June, Michael, Faye, and Lana. Troy and his family were active members of Azalea Baptist Church, where he served many years as a teacher, deacon, member of the Finance Committee, and church Trustee. Troy was an active participant in the Azalea Gardens Civic League and the Retired Officers Association. He worked closely with the Norfolk Police and the Sheriff's Departments, and helped to initiate the Neighborhood Watch program. He enjoyed serving as an AARP Tax Aide volunteer for many years. He enjoyed genealogy, local politics, and was also an avid gardener.

In 2010, Troy moved to Vinson Hall in McLean, Virginia to be closer to his four daughters and their families. He was proud to be the Grandfather to: Jefferson, Symmonie, Audrey, Wendy, Lori, Julie, Kelley, and Whitney as well as the Great-Grandfather to: Kender, Joshua, Ruby, Kaitlin, Tallulah, Maya, and Nick.

In July, 2011 Troy was honored for 60 years of service as a Mason of Tennille Lodge No. 256. He has participated in several studies on senior citizens as well.

Funeral services and Burial were held at Quantico National Cemetery on October 9 at 1:30 pm. Reverend Steve Epperson officiated.
